On behalf of the Clayton Community Library Foundation I want to thank you for the donation of \$50 to purchase books in honor of Women's History Month. The following books have been ordered and will soon be available for check out: All the Single Ladies: Unmarried Women and the Rise of an Independent Nation by Rebecca Traister, Bad Girls Through History: 100 Remarkable Women Who Changed the World by Ann Shen, and The Glass Universe: How the Ladies of the Harvard Observatory Took the Measure of the Stars by Dava Sobel. Each book will have a book plate placed at the front indicating the AAUW Clayton Branch donation in honor of Women's History Month.

We are so lucky to live in a community that helps to sustain their library. The Clayton Community Library Foundation is committed to provide a minimum of \$25,000 annually for books, materials, furniture and volunteer support.

In 2016 CCLF spent over \$44,000 to support the Clayton Community Library because of the backing from our community. This amount included \$5,605 in-kind donations of used books and other materials from our generous patrons. Our book sales, the in-Library Book Store and online sale of books grossed over \$14,601 in 2016. These used book sales plus membership drives and corporate matching gifts combined with individual gifts make it possible to meet our goal. In addition, we are appealing for increased donations from our members, matching gifts from corporations, and donations from community groups such as AAUW.

Thank you again for your donation which will provide more books and materials for the Clayton Community Library. It is wonderful to live in a community that values libraries. Our library is truly unique in that we have functioned for twenty two years with a reduced staff and a large number of dedicated volunteers. Clayton remains a very busy branch of the County library system. Everyone comments on our friendly and helpful staff and volunteers. I am convinced that our success is the result of dedicated staff, terrific volunteers and community support such as yours.


