Youth Homes serves children and adolescents and their families through residential and communitybased mental health programs. The goal is to reunify families, whenever possible. For some children, this may not be possible. Therefore, the focus is on creating the warmest, healthiest, most supportive alternatives we can-either in one of our residences, with a healthy relative or with a foster family.

Youth Homes also has programs for young adults to help them launch from the foster care system. Services include mental health and case management support as they transition to adulthood and continue working through childhood traumas.

Youth Homes was founded 50+ years ago and is based in Pleasant Hill.
